'MANNA FROM HEAVEN'

With this 'manna,' we will first buy back Winterhaven, the Pierre Monteux home which Gatcomb Grant Building has completely renovated, at what is also a very generous price. This will enable us to house ten musicians and save a budgeted \$7500 per year. We are grateful, and we mean to be good stewards of this generous gift.

TAMARACK PLACE RENOVATIONS

As the internet (Airbnb, VRBO) has driven up rental costs, we are trying to secure as much of our own housing for students as possible. With the help of our top-notch tradespeople—Gatcomb Grant Building (667-3305), My Three Sons Plumbing (479-4721), and David Green Electric (266-7683), we are converting office space into three twin-bed rooms, showers and laundry space, two soundproof practice rooms, and an office for our emerging Pierre Monteux Archive. This should save us another \$4500 per year at today's rental costs—and rising fast! Our tradespeople are THE BEST. Need work? Call them!

We advertise our classic Maine cabins as 'rustic'... We are giving their showers and bathrooms a redo, and our students will be nodding heads in agreement. Less 'country plumbing' and a bit more comfort.

ED Plans Retirement in 2018

In 1981 my spouse, Doug Kimmel, and I spotted a small real estate ad in the *NY Times* advertising a house in the Bar Harbor area that was "secluded, but not isolated." We purchased the Taunton Bay property that year and later learned from a neighbor – Adeleine Peake – that we lived barely a mile from an amazing summer training program for conductors founded by the renowned French-born conductor Pierre Monteux. It took no more than attending our first concerts in 1982 to realize that we had stumbled upon a real gem of an institution.

Several summers later I had the pleasure of meeting Pierre's stepdaughter Nancie at the Hancock post office, and we became fast friends. It was a frequent practice to sit with her in Winterhaven – the family home – to sip tea and learn about her childhood, her performances, the School and, of course, her illustrious stepfather. In 1990 Nancie asked if I might be interested in joining the School's Board of Trustees, and in barely the blink of an eye I started the wonderful journey that I remain on to this day.

For many years, I have had the pleasure of serving as Administrator and Executive Director of the Pierre Monteux School for Conductors and Orchestra Musicians, now known as the Pierre Monteux School and Music Festival. When I was appointed to the position in 2006 I had no way of knowing how much of my life working in this capacity would occupy, and how much joy and satisfaction this work would bring me.

It was therefore with a substantial mix of gratitude and melancholy that I recently informed our Trustees of my plans to retire at the end of our 75th Anniversary Season, effective August 31, 2018.

Trustees acknowledged my decision graciously, with the understanding that I would work with the Executive Director Designate to make the forthcoming transition as smooth a process as possible.

Over the past several weeks a committee of the board has worked diligently to structure a search
